

To achieve the true potential of organic cotton, we must the address challenges that hamper the health and growth of the sector

What are the challenges facing organic cotton?



The farmer business case is under pressure

- Lack of access to quality organic seeds
- Lower yields and profits while lacking secure offtake of organic produce
- Organic differentials often do not end up in the farmers' hands



An insecure business case for the value chain

- Supply insecurity and integrity challenges
- Quality and contamination issues
- Lack of supply chain transparency



Fragmented organization of the sector

- Main actors in the sector are not aligned on a vision for the future
- Initiatives to tackle supply and demand challenges are fragmented



OCA has developed three integrated programmes to deliver the solutions critical to the sectors progress

OCA's three pillar programs



Farm Engagement and Development (FED)

Sourcing and capacity building program delivering integrity and prosperity at farmer level



Seed, Integrity and Community Investment (SICI)

Non-competitive solutions that benefit the entire organic cotton sector.



Organic Cotton Fund (OCF)*

providing access to funding and finance for scale and innovation

Seed, Integrity and Community Investment (SICI)





The SICI programme works on non-competitive solutions that benefit the entire organic cotton sector

SICI Focus areas

Seeds: Improve the availability and diversity of non-GM cottonseed in key production regions, starting in India

- Seeding the Green Future (long-term/breeding)
- Non-GM cottonseed production standard (shortterm)
- Initiate Global Seed Initiative
 Task Force



Integrity & Traceability: enable improved integrity and transparency in organic cotton production through adequate tools and technology

- GMO-screening protocol in cotton and textiles (ISO)
- Organic Cotton Traceability Pilot & future Textiles Traceability Task Force (onproduct markers)

Community Investments (currently in exploration/TBD):

Initiatives that support organic farming communities through agricultural centers (inputs, tools, etc.), access to and efficient use of water, education, gender mobility and income diversification

Participatory breeding focusses on improving all the important traits for (organic) cotton

- Fiber quality, e.g.:
 - Staple length
 - Fiber strength
 - Fiber fineness
- Ginning outturn



Producers

- Increased yield
- Increased tolerance of environmental pressures (e.g. drought, salinity)
- Pest and disease resistance




Organic standard

- No genetic modification (non-GM/non-Bt)
- Good performance under organic growing conditions (low-input use)

Improve non-GM cotton availability and supply




Build capacity and network among sector stakeholders

Seeding the Green Future is currently active across six Indian states, with an expanding network of partners



Key figures at end of 2018-19



>30 genotypes evaluated

8 own breeding lines introduced to farm trials



5 on-station research trials 150 on-farm trials



1,042 farmers attended training

in cultivar evaluation

125 farmers trained in field testing & multiplication

84 trainers introduced to professional breeding, cultivar development and selection procedures



Growing local partner network, incl. research institutes, FPOs, and State Agriculture Universities



SGF is a key sector investment in the long-term to ensure quality organic seed availability in India

Ambitions to increase:



Reach of farmers (incl. women) and partners



New cotton lines



Regions included

Key enablers:

- Building further capacity for participatory plant breeding and seed multiplication
- Securing trial quality by trialing best practices in crop management, plant protection and seed multiplication
- ✓ Availability of infrastructures like polyhouses and seed storage facilities
- Application of novel breeding tools (e.g. marker assisted selection) to speed up cultivar development
- Successful fundraising from sector (industry and donors)
